Greymist Fair

Greymist Fair is a suspenseful and inventive tale inspired by the lesser-known fairytales of the Brothers Grimm. It will bewitch readers of Rachel Vincent's *Red Wolf*, Liz Braswell's *A Twisted Tale* series, and fans of *Into the Woods*.

Two roads lead into a dark forest. They meet at Greymist Fair, the village hidden in the trees, a place kept alive by the families that never leave. The people of Greymist Fair know the woods are a dangerous and magical place, and that they should never set foot off the road. But when the village's young tailor discovers a body on the road, her search for the culprit reveals even more strange and dark happenings around her town.

Told from multiple points of view, with each narrative building on the crime, GREYMIST FAIR examines the themes of childhood fears, growing into adult responsibilities, and finding a place to call home amid the trials of life and death.
